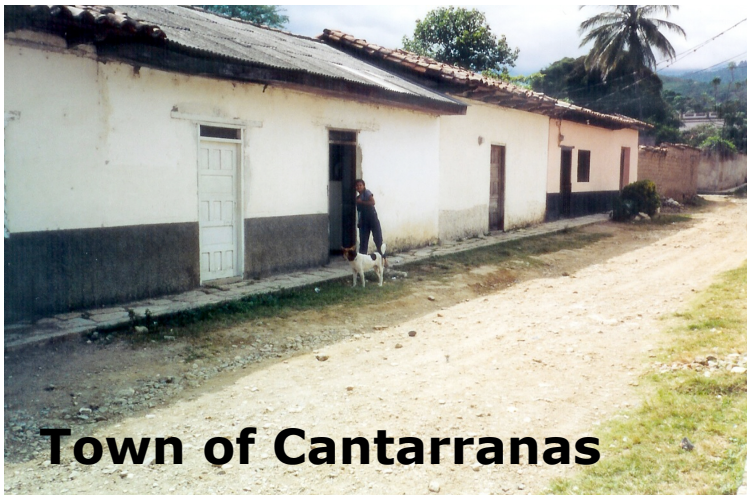
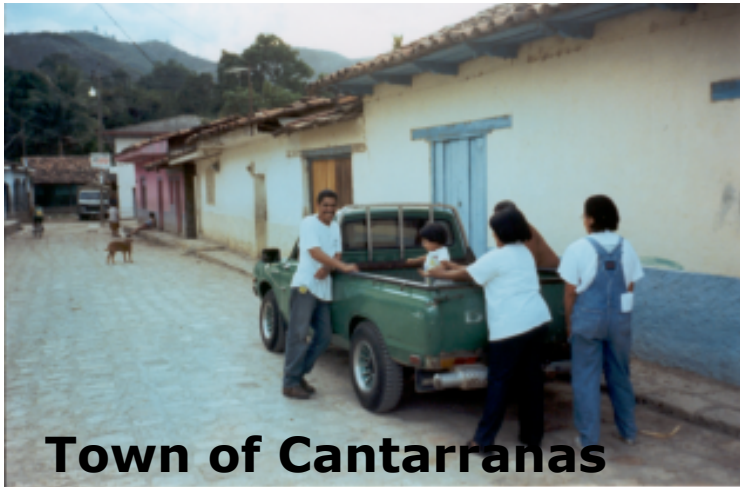

- Vocational Education Center

□ Working Environment

- Remote villages up to 7 hours walk away
- In town working with the community leaders
- In Tegucigalpa (capital) on funding, logistics etc..

Projects With Rotary Club “San Miguel de Heredia” of Tegucigalpa and Salem Sunrise OR - Water /Sanitation

- ❑ Rotary Funded and managed projects
- ❑ Rotary helped negotiate low priced materials

Communities: El Hatillo, Tomatin, Tres Candiles, Trujilliito. Serving over 150 households, schools and public buildings.



Water Projects

- ❑ We designed part (all in some systems) of the water systems
- ❑ Coordinated logistics, in-kind labor, additional fundraising in communities
- ❑ Water board strengthening and education



Water Projects

- We worked on about 5 additional systems, some of which were later funded by Rotary



Communal Banks- Rotary and “Uniendo America”

- ❑ Formation of communal banks with local small business entrepreneurs eg: pastry and candy makers, selling clothing, firewood, tortillas and small corner store owners.
- ❑ Included a series of training and low interest loans to kick start or improve businesses



Communal Banks

- ▣ Members also made small interest bearing loans to other small businesses
- ▣ Rotary (San Miguel de Heredia-Tegucigalpa) supplied capital, training, oversight and ongoing assistance.
